HE CONNECT



August has brought lots of heart wrenching crisis' to our nation from Charlottesville to Houston and from Texas to Louisiana. In the midst of all these things be reminded from the psalmist "Thy throne, O God, is for ever and ever:" Psalm 45:6 Jeremiah also was weeping over the troubles of his nation when he said, "Thou, O Lord, remainest for ever; Thy throne from generation to generation." Lamentations 6:13 God is still on His throne and we can find peace even in the midst of storms as we remain in His presence.

I want to continually remind us of the <u>Mission</u>, <u>Vision</u> and the <u>Objectives</u> of our church so that we have more clarity in what we are doing as a church and why we are doing it. The <u>Mission</u> of our church is to glorify God through the inward edification and the outward multiplication of followers of Christ! Our <u>Mission</u> hinges on our fulfilling the two <u>Great Commandments—to Love God & Love Others</u>. Jesus said that all the law and prophets hang on these two commands. Our <u>Mission</u> has defined our <u>Vision</u> which is to <u>CONNECT</u> with God & Others, <u>GROW</u> in Quality & Quantity, <u>SERVE</u> in the Church, and <u>GO</u> Share Jesus. <u>Finally</u>, we have developed 5 <u>Objectives</u> to give us tangible ways to measure if we are fulfilling our <u>Vision</u> and the <u>Mission</u>. The <u>Objectives</u> are goals that we are seeking to fulfill over the next 5 years, ending in 2022! This month I want to focus on giving more detail about the second objective.

The Objectives are:

- 1. To see at least 17 individuals annually saved, baptized and set on the road to discipleship by 2022
- 2. To see our Sunday morning attendance reach 300 by 2022 Where are we currently at? The Morning Worship average was 150 last year, for the last 10 years the average was 154, so far this year the average is 197! Years ago the number one entry point to the church for guests was the Sunday School class. However, that reality has changed and now it is the worship service. The worship service is to be a special time for those who have gathered together to focus on the presence of and worship of our Creator, our Savior, and our Provider. If the Mission of the church hinges on our fulfilling the two Great Commandments- to Love God & Love Others then we must seek to focus our worship more on God and others! All too often the worship service in churches has become about what our preferences are and not about how we can make the worship experience at our church more focused on God and creating a meaningful worship experience for our guests. Reaching an attendance of 300 in the morning worship attendance will help us to impact more lives with the Gospel and to develop faithful committed followers of Jesus Christ. There are plenty of habits, we as Christians need to be practicing, such as prayer, reading and study of the Scriptures, singing, sharing the gospel, and helping and loving others. Sometimes we call these things spiritual disciplines; their purpose is for spiritual growth and they are to be done out of loving obedience. But is there one single habit that's the most important? David Mathis, executive editor for desirinGod.org and author of *Habits of* Grace, has written an article for desiringGod.org entitled Your Single Most Important Habit. Mathis states, "While I cannot commend one keystone habit that will make the difference for every believer, I do want to speak up on behalf of one weekly habit that is utterly essential to any healthy, life-giving, joy-producing Christian walk: corporate worship. And it is all too often neglected, or taken very lightly, in our day of disembodiment and in our proclivity for being noncommittal. In fact, I do not think it is too strong to call corporate worship the single most important habit of the Christian life."

The reason this is true is because corporate worship is where we find encouragement in all the other spiritual habits vital to the Christian life. Believers are meant to be together, to learn together, worship together, to pray for each other, and encourage each other. Mathis goes on to say, "The reason corporate worship may be the single most important Christian habit, and our greatest weapon in the fight for joy, is because like no other single habit, corporate worship combines all three essential principles of God's ongoing supply of grace for the Christian life: hearing his voice (in his word), having his ear (in prayer), and belonging to his body (in the fellowship of the church)." Not attending church can become a bad habit for Christians, and one that may not seem like a big deal. You may not feel like going that morning, you may be tired, and you may not feel like it's necessary every week. But remember, "God didn't make us to live and worship as solitary individuals." So when believers neglect corporate worship, we are neglecting God's design. If God's Word expresses the importance of meeting together in worship, then we can guarantee it's something He desires us to take part in. Mathis goes on to say, "And just to be sure, the reason to make corporate worship a habit is not to check the box on perfect attendance, and not because corporate worship alone is enough to fully power the Christian life, and not because mere attendance in worship will save your soul. This is not a call for legalistic going-throughthe-motions. The hope is not just to show up and be a shell. Rather, this is a summons to harness the power of habit to rescue our souls from empty excuses that keep us from spiritual riches and increasing joy. Negligence and chronic minimizing of the importance of corporate worship reveal something unhealthy and scary in our souls. Let's resist it with fresh resolve." There is grace in spiritual habits, including corporate worship. Let me encourage you to invite others to every worship service, every Sunday.

- 3. To see our annual giving increase to at least \$400,000 by 2022
- 4. To see at least 100 members discover and use their spiritual gifts to serve in the church by 2022
- 5. To see at least 100 individuals trained and sharing the gospel locally and around the world by
