All too often these days we are hearing about "my rights", and "my freedoms" and how those are to balance with our responsibilities. I love our nation and the freedoms that the Constitution affords us but as a Christian, we are to sacrifice our rights and our freedoms and surrender to God's will for our lives. In fulfilling God's plan for our lives, we need to be seeking to show the love of Christ to others. Philippians 2:3 tells us, that we are to "in humility count others more significant than yourselves." When we put other's needs (as long as those needs are not against God's Word) before our own we are being examples of Jesus' love.

John the Apostle tells us that God is spirit, God is light, and God is love. In 1 John 4:8 he doesn't say, "God is loving" he says, "God is love," and there's a difference. We might say that a person we know is a "loving" person, and we understand what that means. But God is not just "loving"—He is love. That means the very essence of His nature is love; everything He does is a demonstration of love; He can't do anything that is not love. God set the example for how we're to love by loving us "in spite of" ourselves. The clearest sign of God-like love is when someone loves another despite what they've done wrong, which is how God loves us. St. Augustine wrote, "He loves each one of us as if we were the only one to love."

To have that kind of sacrificial love, the first step we need to take is *surrender*. To surrender means to relinquish possession or control to another, to submit to the power, authority, and control of another. Philippians 2:6-8, shows us that Jesus was willing to surrender His rights and prerogatives to the will, purpose, and plan of the Father. Then, out of that surrender came the willingness for Jesus to sacrifice for God's plan no matter what the plan called for.

The next step that follows surrendering to God is *sacrifice*—loving at a loss. The aspect of sacrifice is also emphasized in Philippians 2:6-8 by the words, "He humbled himself, by becoming obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross!" Surrendering to the Father's will, He emptied Himself, became man and was found in the form of a servant. Jesus willingly gave Himself sacrificially that God's will might be fulfilled in and through His life and death. There's a story about a little boy whose sister needed a blood transfusion to live. The boy had suffered and recovered from the same disease and built up immunity to it in his blood.

Because they shared the same rare blood type, the little boy was the only donor available. He agreed to donate his blood so his sister could live. As the nurse put the needle into his arm, the boy watched his blood begin to drain out of his body through the plastic tube. He looked up at the doctor and asked seriously, "Doctor, when do I die?" Neither the doctor nor the family realized that the little boy thought he was giving up his life—his blood—so his sister could live. But that's what he was prepared to do. What a picture that is of the kind of sacrificial love God has for us. It's genuine, sacrificial love when we see someone willing to give up their life for another person. That kind of selfless, sacrificial love seeks nothing in return; it seeks only the benefit and well-being of the one loved. God reached down from heaven for our benefit and loved us and saved us in spite of the fact that we had nothing to offer Him in return.

You may be thinking but what does that have to do with us? Although rights, privileges, pleasures, possessions, expectations, and well-formed plans may not be wrong in and of themselves, are we willing to let those things go—to sacrifice them—if emptying ourselves of them will enable us to fulfill God's agenda for our lives? We're told in God's Word that we're to surrender ourselves as living sacrifices. When we do that it also means sacrificing ourselves. Self-sacrifice means putting the Lord first above self and even family. Let us continue in these days that we're living to show the world around us the kind of self-sacrificing love that puts others first.
