As we enter this month-long emphasis on Praying for Your One, we're reminded that we can bless others when we share the Gospel! I also want to share with you that as Christians, we have been called to be salt and light in the world, which demands that we live a life of holiness that is different from the world. But what does different mean? The dictionary says "distinct, separate, not the same, out of the ordinary, unusual." Shouldn't Christians be different? Shouldn't we be distinct, separate, not the same, out of the ordinary, unusual like Jesus was? The Biblical word holy describes the contemporary word different. A holy person isn't an odd person but a different person. Peter wrote in 1 Peter 1:15-16, "15 but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, 16 since it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy."" It's not left to us to choose whether or not we live a holy life. Holiness is not an option. It's mandatory. All too often, we have a problem with being holy or different from Christ. We say, "Hold the phone, wait just a minute. This holiness thing is just a little bit too much for me." The problem is that we don't want to be different. Why is that? One, we value conformity. We don't want to stand out from the crowd. We wear the same style of clothes, talk the latest talk, and conform to the "in" things. We don't want to be perceived as being odd. We're terrified of being set apart. Secondly, we imagine an idea of what holiness is. We don't like the idea of holiness because we think it means to be "holier-than- thou." We don't like putting something on a pedestal as being better than the rest. And thirdly, we misunderstand what it means to be holy. Sometimes, living a life of holiness conjures up images of being a monk or priest. We think that holy people live in far-away monasteries, separating themselves from any kind of fun and trading in their nice cars, comfortable homes, and well-paying jobs for a monk's lifestyle. Consequently, we say, "That's not for me." Real holiness, the genuine and authentic character of being different like God, is none of those things. It's more than that. Holiness is one of the essential elements of God's nature that is required of His people.

Holiness may also be understood by the words "sanctification" or "godliness." The Hebrew word for "holy" means that which is "sanctified" or "set apart" for divine service. While the word "holy" is sometimes used in a ceremonial sense, the primary use of the word is to describe God's righteousness that is to be evidenced in His followers. What does it mean to be holy or different from God? Peter tells us that it means that we're to think differently. 1 Peter 1:13 says, "13 Therefore, preparing your minds for action, and being sober-minded, set your hope fully on the grace that will be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ." To be different begins with the proper preparation of our minds. Peter uses a Middle Eastern analogy to describe how one prepares their minds, "let your loins be girded or stay dressed for action or preparing your minds for action." During his time, men wore long, flowing robes. When they were preparing to run or to do physical labor, they usually lifted their robes and secured them with a belt or girdle around their waist. That allowed them the freedom of movement to perform their work or run to the



Today, we would use the expression "roll up our sleeves." In other words, we're to take the initiative in preparing our minds for the life of holiness. It'll require effort and hard work. The writer of Proverbs says in Proverbs 23:7, "For as he thinks in his heart, so is he." The apostle Paul warns us not to let the world squeeze us into its mold, "2 Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." Romans 12:2 So let us live holy lives, set apart for God's purpose so that we can make the greatest eternal difference for His kingdom work this Easter!
